To support MOC reflection opportunities, the 2025 Annual Assembly offers end of day accredited education homerooms in the in-person space where learners engage with faculty and colleagues to share key learning points and discuss session reflections. Learners are asked to choose sessions reflective of their top learning priorities and to keep track of at least one key learning point from each attended session for reflective learning.

AAHPM has registered the 2025 Annual Assembly of Hospice and Palliative Care to offer MOC points to the following certifying Boards:
